$$\textcircled{1} \text{ (a)} A = \begin{pmatrix} 2 & -k & -1 \\ k+2 & 0 & 4 \\ -3 & k & 2 \end{pmatrix}$$

$A$  invertible  $\Leftrightarrow \det(A) \neq 0$ ; in tal caso  $A^{-1} = (b_{ij})$

$$b_{ii} = \frac{(-1)^{i+i}}{\det(A)} \cdot \text{det}(A_{ji})$$

$$\det(A) = \det \begin{pmatrix} 2 & -k & -1 \\ k+2 & 0 & 4 \\ -1 & 0 & 1 \end{pmatrix} \quad \text{R}_3 + \text{R}_1$$

$$= (-1)^{1+2} \cdot (-k) \cdot \det \begin{pmatrix} k+2 & 4 \\ -1 & 1 \end{pmatrix}$$

$$\begin{aligned} \det(A) &= \\ &= \sum_{i=1}^m (-1)^{i+i} a_{ii} \det(A_{ii}) \\ &= \sum_{i=1}^m (-1)^{i+i} a_{ii} \det(A_{ii}) \end{aligned}$$

$$= k \cdot (k+6)$$

$$A = \begin{pmatrix} 2 & -k & -1 \\ k+2 & 0 & 4 \\ -3 & k & 2 \end{pmatrix}$$

$\exists A^{-1} \neq k \neq 0, -6$

$$A^{-1} = \frac{1}{k(k+6)} \cdot \begin{pmatrix} -4k & k & -4k \\ -2k-16 & * & * \\ * & * & * \end{pmatrix}$$

$$(b) \quad A = \begin{pmatrix} 1-k & 3k & -1 \\ 2k-2 & 0 & 2 \\ k-1 & 1 & 1 \end{pmatrix}$$

$$\det \begin{pmatrix} 1+2k-3k^2 & 0 & -1-3k \\ 2k-2 & 0 & 2 \\ k-1 & 1 & 1 \end{pmatrix} \quad R_1 - 3k \cdot R_3$$

$$= - \det \begin{pmatrix} 1+2k-3k^2 & -1-3k \\ 2k-2 & 2 \end{pmatrix}$$

$$= -2 \cdot \det \begin{pmatrix} 1+2k-3k^2 & -1-3k \\ k-1 & 1 \end{pmatrix}$$

$$= -2 \cdot (1+2k-3k^2 + k + 3k^2 - 1 - 3k) = 0$$

$$(c) \quad A = \begin{pmatrix} 1 & k & -1 \\ -k & 1 & 2 \\ 0 & 0 & 1 \end{pmatrix}$$

$$\det(A) = \det \begin{pmatrix} 1 & k \\ -k & 1 \end{pmatrix} = 1+k^2$$

$$A^{-1} = \frac{1}{1+k^2} \cdot \begin{pmatrix} 1 & -k & 2k+1 \\ k & * & * \\ * & * & * \end{pmatrix}$$

$$(d) \quad \det \begin{pmatrix} a_{11} & a_{12} & \dots & a_{1m} \\ 0 & a_{22} & a_{23} & \dots & a_{2m} \\ 0 & 0 & a_{33} & \dots & a_{3m} \\ \vdots & & \ddots & \ddots & \vdots \\ 0 & \ddots & \ddots & \ddots & a_{nn} \end{pmatrix}$$

$$= a_{11} \cdot \det \begin{pmatrix} a_{22} & a_{23} & \dots & a_{2n} \\ 0 & a_{33} & \dots & a_{3n} \\ \vdots & \ddots & \ddots & \vdots \\ 0 & \dots & \dots & a_{nn} \end{pmatrix}$$

$$= a_{11} \cdot a_{22} \cdot \dots \cdot a_{nn}$$

$$\textcircled{3} \textcircled{a} \det \begin{pmatrix} 1 & 0 & -1 & 1 \\ 3 & 2 & 3 & 2 \\ -1 & -1 & 1 & -1 \\ 1 & 1 & -1 & -1 \end{pmatrix}$$

$$= 1 \cdot 2 \cdot 1 + 0 \cdot 3 \cdot (-1) + (-1) \cdot 3 \cdot (-1) \\ - (-1) \cdot 2 \cdot (-1) + 1 \cdot 3 \cdot (-1) + 0 \cdot 3 \cdot 1 = \dots$$

$$\textcircled{b} \det \begin{pmatrix} 0 & 2 & -1 & -3 \\ 4 & 1 & 0 & 0 \\ 2 & -1 & 1 & 0 \\ 1 & 0 & -2 & 0 \end{pmatrix}$$

$$= -(-3) \cdot \det \begin{pmatrix} 4 & 1 & 0 \\ 2 & -1 & 1 \\ 1 & 0 & -2 \end{pmatrix}$$

$$= 3 \cdot \det \begin{pmatrix} 4 & 1 & 0 \\ 6 & 0 & 1 \\ 1 & 0 & -2 \end{pmatrix} = 3 \cdot (-1) \cdot 1 \cdot \det \begin{pmatrix} 6 & 1 \\ 1 & -2 \end{pmatrix}$$

$$= 39$$

$$(c) \det \begin{pmatrix} 5 & 2 & -1 & 1 \\ 1 & -1 & 0 & 0 \\ 4 & 3 & -1 & 1 \\ 1 & 0 & 0 & 3 \end{pmatrix}$$

$$= \det \begin{pmatrix} 5 & 7 & -1 & 1 \\ 1 & 0 & 0 & 0 \\ 4 & 7 & -1 & 1 \\ 1 & 1 & 0 & 3 \end{pmatrix}$$

$C_2 + C_1$

$$= -\det \begin{pmatrix} 7 & -1 & 1 \\ 7 & -1 & 1 \\ 1 & 0 & 3 \end{pmatrix} = 0$$

$$(d) \det \begin{pmatrix} 1 & 2 & 1 & 1 \\ 2 & 1 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & 1 & 1 & 0 \\ 3 & 2 & 1 & 1 \end{pmatrix}$$

$$= \det \begin{pmatrix} -3 & 2 & 1 & 1 \\ 0 & 1 & 0 & 0 \\ -2 & 1 & 1 & 0 \\ -1 & 2 & 1 & 1 \end{pmatrix} = -\det \begin{pmatrix} 3 & 1 & 1 \\ 2 & 1 & 0 \\ 1 & 1 & 1 \end{pmatrix}$$

$$C_1 - 2 \cdot C_2$$

$$= -\det \begin{pmatrix} 2 & 0 & 0 \\ 2 & 1 & 0 \\ 1 & 1 & 1 \end{pmatrix} \quad R_1 - R_3$$

$= -2$

Un metodo per trovare l'inverso :

$m \times m$

- $A \in \mathbb{R}^{m \times m}$
- $T = (A, I_m)$
- faccio operazioni  $\overline{T} \rightsquigarrow \overline{T}'$  con operazioni  
sulle righe : sostituisco a una riga  $\alpha \cdot$  lei  
+  $\beta$  un'altra ; e ( $\text{scambio d. riga}$ )

- mi succede a  $(I_m, B)$
- Fatto:  $B = A^{-1}$ .

Peché funziona? Una operazione sulle righe  $T \rightarrow T'$   
realizza  $T' = M \cdot T$  con  $M \in M_{m \times m}$

$$T = \begin{pmatrix} & \pi_1 \\ & \vdots \\ & \pi_m \end{pmatrix}$$

sostituire  $\pi_i$  con  $\alpha\pi_i + \beta\pi_j$   
si realizza con

$$i \rightarrow \begin{pmatrix} 1 & 0 & \cdots & 0 \\ 0 & 1 & \cdots & 0 \\ \vdots & \ddots & \ddots & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & \cdots & 0 \\ 1 & 0 & \cdots & 0 \\ \vdots & \ddots & \ddots & 1 \end{pmatrix} T$$

Dunque  $T = (A, I_m) \xrightarrow{k \text{ opere}} (I_m, B)$

$$\Rightarrow (I_m, B) = \underbrace{(M_k \cdots M_3 \cdot M_2 \cdot M_1)}_M \cdot (A, I_m)$$

$$(I_m, B) = M \cdot (A, I_m)$$

$$\begin{cases} M \cdot A = I_m \\ M \cdot I_m = B \end{cases} \Rightarrow \begin{cases} M = A^{-1} \\ B = M \end{cases}$$

$$\Rightarrow B = A^{-1}$$

$$A = \begin{pmatrix} 3 & 2 & -1 \\ 4 & 1 & 3 \\ -2 & 7 & 5 \end{pmatrix}$$

$$\begin{pmatrix} 3 & 2 & -1 & 1 & 0 & 0 \\ 4 & 1 & 3 & 0 & 1 & 0 \\ -2 & 7 & 5 & 0 & 0 & 1 \end{pmatrix}$$

$$\begin{pmatrix} 3 & 2 & -1 & 1 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & -5 & 13 & -4 & 3 & 0 \\ 0 & 25 & 13 & 2 & 0 & -3 \end{pmatrix} \quad \begin{aligned} 3\pi_2 - 4\pi_1 \\ 3\pi_3 + 2\pi_1 \end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{pmatrix} 3 & 2 & -1 & 1 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & -5 & 13 & -4 & 3 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 78 & -18 & 15 & 3 \end{pmatrix} \quad \pi_3 + 5\pi_2$$

$$\begin{pmatrix} 3 & 2 & -1 & 1 & 0 & 0 \\ 0 & -5 & 13 & -4 & 3 & 0 \\ 0 & 0 & 26 & -6 & 5 & 1 \end{pmatrix} \quad \frac{1}{3} \cdot \pi_3$$

$$\begin{pmatrix} 78 & 52 & 0 & 20 & 5 & 1 \\ 0 & -10 & 0 & -2 & 1 & -1 \\ 0 & 0 & 26 & -6 & 5 & 1 \end{pmatrix} \quad \begin{aligned} 26\pi_1 + \pi_3 \\ 2\pi_2 - \pi_3 \end{aligned}$$

$$\begin{pmatrix} 390 & 0 & 0 & 48 & 51 & -21 \\ 0 & -10 & 0 & -2 & 1 & -1 \\ 0 & 0 & 26 & -6 & 5 & 1 \end{pmatrix} \quad 5\pi_1 + 26\pi_2$$

$$\begin{pmatrix} 1 & 0 & 0 & 8/65 & 17/130 & -7/130 \\ 0 & 1 & 0 & 1/5 & -1/10 & 1/10 \\ 0 & 0 & 1 & -3/13 & 5/26 & 1/26 \end{pmatrix} \quad \begin{aligned} \pi_1/390 \\ \pi_2/-5 \\ \pi_3/26 \end{aligned}$$

$\boxed{\left( \begin{array}{cc} a & b \\ c & d \end{array} \right)^{-1} = \frac{1}{ad-bc} \left( \begin{array}{cc} d & -b \\ -c & a \end{array} \right)}$

$$\begin{pmatrix} a & b \\ c & d \end{pmatrix} \begin{pmatrix} d & -b \\ -c & a \end{pmatrix} = \begin{pmatrix} ad-bc & -ab+ad \\ cd-cd & -bc+ad \end{pmatrix}$$
$$= (ad-bc) \begin{pmatrix} 1 & 0 \\ 0 & 1 \end{pmatrix}$$
